



What to Take For Cold Weather Camping

NO: **GLASS** Warm sleeping bag Rain gear (2 piece is best) Sleeping pad (a must for cold weather)) Toothbrush / toothpaste Comb Extra blankets, if needed (may use for pad) Watch (if you have one) Camp suds (if you have them) 2 warm shirts (long sleeved – wool or fleece Flashlight if possible – avoid cotton) Extra batteries 2 tee shirts (to wear under or over long Compass sleeved shirt) 1 qt water bottle 2 Warm long pants (no camouflage) Pocket knife Thermal underwear (anything but Your personal first aid kit (one you cotton) made) Underwear Camera (optional) Bandannas Mess Kit/Silverware 4 pairs socks (they may get wet) Scout Handbook Extra pair of shoes (they may get wet) Money for lunch Warm jacket (no camouflage) Class B uniform (Note: this could Winter hat (good to sleep in) change based on the language in the Gloves or/and mittens permission slip)
